Richard Oberlin, director and actor at Play House

Bichard Oberlin, a veteran actor, stage director and former managing director of the Cleveland Play House, died yesterday at St. Vincent Charity Hospital and Health Center.

He was so.

He had been recuperating at his home in Bratenahl from open-heart surgery, which was performed Dec. 17. He developed complications and was admitted to the hospital yester day morning where h

underwent surgery. Mr. Oberlin resigned as director of the Play House June 30, 1985, after 14 years in that post and a total of 30 years with the theater. He remained a consulting director and had continued as a leading actor. He was internationally known in

the theater. Since joining the Play House in 1955, he had acted in, directed or produced almost 400 plays, he had estimated shortly before his

Mr. Oberlin had one of the leading roles in the current Play House production of 'Orphans," which opened Dec. 9 at the Drury Theater. He appeared for a week and had to leave the role when he became ill.

In the fall of 1985 he was a visiting professor in the graduate theater program at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor and appeared as well in the American premiere of 'Antique Pink'' in the university's new professional theater.

Mr. Oberlin was to be a guest director later this month at the North Carolina School for the Arts in Winston-Salem for the second time.

He was company manager for the National Touring Company of the Play House from 1961 to 1963 when the group performed in 40 states and Canada. He was resident director of the Play House Summer Theater at the Chautaugua Institution in New York for four sea-

sons and an actor there for 15. He had performed with the Showboat Majestic on the Ohio River, in the old Musicarnival and Rabbit Run Theater in Madison.

Mr. Oberlin had been on the executive committee of the League of Resident Theaters, a national group of professional, non-profit theaters. He was a member of the Theater Panel of the Ohio Arts Council and had been a

member of the National Theater Conterence and the Eugene O'Neill Playwrights' Confer-

He had been an adjunct professor of theater at Case Western Reserve University and a visiting lecturer and instructor in acting at Cleveland State University.

In 1973 he was one of two professional resident theater directors in the United States invited by the Federal Republic of Germany for a special theater tour of West Germany. He followed that with a tour to Poland and

East Germany to review theaters. In 1980 Mr. Oberlin received the lifetime achievement award from the Ohio Theater Alliance and later that year received a special citation from the Women's City Club of Cleveland. In 1977 he received a gold medal of excellence for the educational outreach programs of the Play House.

He had been honored by his alma mater, Washington High School in Massillon, where he graduated in 1946. He was inducted into the Drama Hall of Fame at the school where, as a teen-ager, he had leading roles in several

Mr. Oberlin also acted, including the lead in "Hamlet," at the College of Wooster where he received a bachelor's degree in 1952. Between high school and college he was in the Navy. In later years he took graduate courses in theater at Indiana University.

After leaving Wooster, he worked at a radio in Canton and appeared in productions of the Players Guild in Canton.


In 1979, Mr. Oberlin told a reporter, "When I audition an actor. I can tell in about 10 seconds if there's anything there. Even if they're nervous, if they've chosen the wrong material, if their breathing breaks down on them, you can always tell, because there is something absolutely arresting about a good actor.

"With an actor, you look for basic skill, basic technique. And if they're awful and you have to turn them down, I try not to play God and tell them to get out of the business. There is such a thing as a late bloomer."

Mr. Oberlin is survived by his wife, Shirley, brother, R. James of Canton; sister, Jean Fos ter of Sandusky, and parents, Lois and Robert
