If you bought license plates for your car, voted or went ice skating in Brooklyn, chances are you met Mary Bosa, because she worked where all of those activities take place.

Mrs. Bosa, 78, died Saturday at Deaconess Hospital.

She was a member of the Brooklyn Democratic Club, a former member of the Democratic executive committee and served as presiding judge at many elections.

Her family loves to tell of her athletic ability, especially how she beat her sons at one-on-one basketball games when she was 60 years old.

Mrs. Bosa was born in Monongahela, Pa., and lived in Brooklyn.

She was the deputy registrar who ran the Memphis Ave. auto license bureau in the 1980s during the years when Richard F. Celeste was Ohio's governor. She also was a cashier at the city's ice rink.

Mrs. Bosa is survived by her daughter, Patricia Denihan of Hollywood, Fla.; sons Gordon of Alamosa, Colo., and Gene of Brooklyn; nine grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

She was a member of St. Thomas More Catholic Church, 4170 N. Amber Dr. in Brooklyn, where the funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. today. Arrangements have been handled by the Ripepi funeral home, 5762 Pearl Rd., Parma.
