Russian Churchmen's Hosts at Seville Are Kept Secret

Plain Dealer Special WOOSTER, O., June 4 — A two-day stay in Ohio for nine Russian Christian leaders will include all day Thursday in the Wooster area.

The Russian churchmen in the United States on a 10-day tour sponsored by the National Council of Churches, will have lunch at Wooster College and dinner in private homes at nearby Seville in Medina County.

In Seville they will dine in the homes of members of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Baptist Churches. Names of hosts are being withheld for "security" reasons.

Obituary Interpreter Dr. Donald Lowrie, a native of Seville, who is an international YMCA official, arranged for the visit to his home town.

Dr. Lowrie, who spent three years in Siberia in relief work, is interpreter for the Russians for their stay in the United States.

The stay at Wooster will include a tour of the college, as an example of one of the nation's 471 Protestant church-related colleges, and a seminar on Christian higher education.

The churchmen will come here from Toledo, where they will have observed a Wednesday meeting of the National Council of Churches' policy-making general board.

En route they will inspect Mansfield's \$1,000,000 YMCA-YWCA center.

Leader of the Russians, Metropolitan Nicolai, is director of foreign relations of the Russian Orthodox Church. Also in his delegation are Archbishop Konstantine Ruzhitsky, Archbishop Michael Slavitsky and Prof. Vladimir Talizin, all Russian Orthodox; Archbishop Jan Juvit of Estonia and Archbishop Gustave Turis of Latvia, Lutheran; Prof. Ararat Garvian, Armenian Orthodox, and the Rev. Alexei Andreev, Evangelical Christian Baptist.

Pleads Innocent in 2 Auto Deaths

A 20-year-old Wickliffe man pleaded innocent to a second-degree manslaughter charge in Painesville Municipal Court yesterday in connection with the traffic deaths of two Clevelanders Sunday night.

Robert Clemens Jr., 1345 E. 280th Street, was released on \$2,000 bond. Judge Albert W. Hayer set a preliminary hearing for June 20.

Joe Vinogueris, 63, and his wife, Nancy, 52, of 3215 E. 134th Street, were killed when Clemens' car and their automobile hit head on at Routes 20 and 306 in Mentir Township, Lake County.

The accident occurred when Clemens smashed into the rear of another car which had stopped at the intersection for a left turn. Clemens' car then careened across the highway and into the path of the approaching Vinogueris auto. Clemens, who moved to Wickliffe from McMinnville, Tenn., four months ago, received head and face lacerations. Four other persons were injured.

Clemens said he did not see the car ahead of him signaling to turn left until he was close to it. He said he tried to swerve around the stopped auto.
